Internal Audit Annual Report 2012/13

- 2.  - (iii) agreed the response to the proposed action plan.

- 8. Prior to considering the Statement of Accounts the Committee received a short presentation from the Treasurer.
- 9. Following scrutiny of the accounts the Audit and Standards Committee approved the Statement of Accounts 2012/13.

Draft Annual Governance Statement 2012/13

- 10. The Monitoring Officer presented the Draft Annual Governance Statement 2012/13 for approval.
- 11. The Accounts and Audit (England) Regulations 2011 require the Fire and Rescue Authority to review its arrangements for governance and systems for internal control on an annual basis. To meet this requirements the operation of the Authority's governance arrangements is subject to an annual self-assessment against the CIPFA (Chartered Institute of Public Finance and Accountancy) and SOLACE (Society of Local Authority Chief Executives) framework.
- 12. The Audit and Standards Committee approved the Draft Annual Governance Statement 2012/13.

- 13. The Service Manager from Worcestershire Internal Audit Shared Service outlined the Internal Audit Draft Plan for 2013/14.
